REFORMATION IN THE CHURCH IN THIS (AND EVERY) AGE

On Sunday, October 26th, Lutherans around the world will recall the events of October 31st, 1517, when a German monk named Martin Luther used a hammer and nails to post his 95 Theses to the church door in Wittenburg.

What Luther did in posting his Theses to the door wasn't at all unusual. After all, many professors in the seminary there did the same. In effect, what those who nailed their posters to the church door were doing was to say, "This is what I propose to talk about".

It was what Luther wanted to talk about that caused a ruckus. For Luther directly challenged the Western Church's behaviors, beliefs and practices in the time of the Renaissance. In particular, he challenged the Church's love affair with worldly power and money. He challenged the corruption and the lust for power that characterized much of the Church's leadership. He challenged the idea that a person could improve their standing with God by buying Indulgences (the money gained from the sale of these Indulgences financed the building of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome). (Luther saw this practice as a form of the old heresy which is known as Pelagianism...more about that in a future column.) He challenged the Church's decision-making process which depended on one person's dictates (the Pope), a practice which undercut the Church's collective decision-making abilities.

So began what we now call the Reformation, or – more properly – the Protestant Reformation. Recall that the word "Protestant" means to protest. It is certifiably true that Luther was not only protesting what was going on in the Western Church, he was attempting to correct and reform it.

In the wake of the movement that Luther started, the part of the Church that is now known as "Protestant" numbers many thousands of different groupings. (It seems that, oftentimes in life, there are gains and losses. The fracturing of the Church into so many groups is – in many ways – a loss.)

But it wasn't Luther's intention to separate the Western Church into different groups. Instead, he wanted to purify and to reform the Church.

Ponderings of The Pastor Continued

Down through time, God has raised up various persons to challenge the Church's ways, beliefs and behaviors. (In our own time, Martin Luther King is just such a reformer.) In the first few centuries of the Church's existence, there were many challenges to correct belief. We call these ideas "heresies", because they contain some bits of truth, but they don't convey the fulness of it. (The word "heresy" comes to us from the Greek, where it means "to choose".) In my view, there are four basic heresies we ought to know about today, for the Evil One continues to trot out these old, incorrect ideas, often mixing and matching them, repackaging them into new and more attractive offerings. My own short list of these four is: Marcionism, Gnosticism, Arianism and Pelagianism. (More about these in future columns...stay tuned for future exciting installments!)

Which brings us to this important point: The Church stands in need of reform, of change and purification in this and in every age. The reason this is so important is that the Church is called to bear the image of Christ reliably and accurately to the outside and watching world.

To do this, the Church must step back from itself and take a good, hard look at itself. In essence, that's what Luther did...he stepped back, removed himself from the Church as it was in his time, and took a critical look at the Church. He didn't like much of what he saw.

How might we, today, look at the Church to see in what ways it's getting the things of God and of Christ right, and in what ways is it getting the things of God and of Christ wrong?

The blunt truth is that the temptation is always present to lose sight of God's will for the Church, substituting our own flawed will in its place.

So, our task is the same as it has always been in the Church, down through time: To maintain and to cherish that which is good, wholesome and which reflects godly values, and to do away with that which fails to do these things.


The movie Gettysburg 1863 is set to release in November 2026, and we were thrilled to play a small part in its journey!

A huge thank-you to everyone who helped feed the film crew. Your time, effort, and generosity made the day a great success.


Special thanks to all who brought Ham and Bean Soup on Sunday morning—it was delicious and so appreciated!

Learn how to make 2–3 different types of bread and take home a sampling of your creations to share (or enjoy yourself!).




