Ponderings of The Pastor

THE SEASON OF EPIPHANY

As I write this, the Christmas celebration will soon be here. Because the Christmas celebration is such a high point in our society and in the Church, it might be a little challenging to look beyond our Christmas observances to the season which will follow it in the Church's liturgical calendar. But as surely as the secular calendar will turn over into the year 2026, the Church Year will bring us to the Epiphany celebration.

Epiphany concludes the Christmastide season, which is twelve days long (as the well-known song "The Twelve Days of Christmas" reminds us). Epiphany, therefore, always falls on January 6th. (Yes, I know, the world around us began looking forward to, and celebrating, Christmas sometime in October, and it's a sure bet that many Christmas decorations will come down promptly on December 26th, but the Church is on a different timeframe.)

The Epiphany season's length is variable, because its length is determined by the date upon which Easter falls (that date can vary from as early as March 22nd, or as late as April 25th). Preceding the Easter celebration, we observe the season of Lent, which is forty days long (minus the Sundays in the Lenten season). So Ash Wednesday, which begins the Lenten season, also ends the Epiphany season. Working backward from Easter, we find that the Epiphany season can, therefore, have as few as four Sundays, or as many as nine.

The Church's calendar may be divided into two cycles, each one following a pattern, which is:

Preparation: Advent & Lent - Color: Blue (Advent)-or-Violet (Lent)

Celebration: Christmas & Easter - Color: White

Application: Epiphany & Pentecost – Color: Green

The word "Epiphany" means "appearing" or "manifestation". Following on this understanding, then, the season of Epiphany carries subtitle: "The Manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ to the Gentiles".

The Epiphany season always begins by honoring and remembering the visit of the Magi (the Wise Men), to the Christ child. (Since I can't resist, it's worth remembering that the familiar carol "We Three Kings" isn't a Christmas carol, it's an Epiphany carol.) We don't know anything much about the identity of these visitors "from the east" (as Matthew tells us). We don't know how many Magi there were (although tradition says that there were three – perhaps because of the gifts of gold, incense and myrrh that were offered to the young Jesus). Nor do we know exactly when they came to Bethlehem. These days, the manger scenes that are a common part of our Christmas celebrations most often also include the Wise Men, but a careful reading of Matthew's Gospel account reveals that the visit of the Magi may have taken place sometime after Jesus' birth. Matthew uses the word "child" to describe Jesus (see Matthew 2:9). And then, a few verses later, Matthew uses the word "house" to describe where the Holy Family was (see Matthew 2:11). Furthermore, when King Herod found out that the Wise Men hadn't returned to report what they had found on their visit to the Holy Family, he ordered that all the boys in Bethlehem to be killed who were two years old and younger (an event we remember each year on December 28th). That tells us that, quite likely, Jesus was no longer a baby, and may have been as much as almost two years old.

The visit of these foreign visitors from somewhere in the east marks the beginning of the realization that the wonderful gift of the coming of Jesus into the world isn't just for God's chosen people alone. That wonderful gift is meant for all people, in every place, and in every time.

Eventually, the gift of Jesus to God's chosen people, and to you and me (Gentiles) meant that the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ isn't a God to be worshipped, loved and served by a specific ethnic or racial group. In the ancient world, this was somewhat of a radical idea, for each place, each grouping of human beings often had their own gods and goddesses. Think of the city of Ephesus and its goddess, Artemis (see Acts 18:23 – 27) as one example.

In the fulness of time, the gift of Jesus Christ, He who is the light of the world, was to make its way out into the Gentile world, and, in the fulness of time, to you and to me (Gentiles).

But the idea that God, the creator of all that is, should be proclaimed and known to peoples everywhere was a valued part of the Old Testament tradition. To God's people in ancient times, God said, "I will give you as a light to the nations" (Isaiah 49:6).

We noted a bit ago that the Epiphany season is one of "application". How might we, in our time and place, working together as God's people at Flohr's Church, do our part to share the Good News of God in Christ, even as we have received the light of the Gospel from others who shared that wonderful gift with us at some point in our lives?

That task just might be one of our most important New Year's resolutions.

Happy New Year, one and all, and a Blessed Epiphany celebration and season.


