Ponderings of The Pastor

WELCOMING A "HAPPY LENT"

Early on Ash Wednesday, some one of the two of the Tuckers will look at the other one as that early morning cup of coffee is being savored, and say to the other, "Happy Lent, dear".

To the one receiving this greeting, and who is trying desperately to "blend into the day" (as an old Army buddy of mine used to say), this greeting usually generates a good smile, which is followed by some discussion about the nature of the Lenten season that lies ahead.

Isn't the idea of Lent being "happy" an oxymoron? Isn't Lent the time when we're supposed to put away all that stuff we enjoy (but know isn't really good for us)? Isn't Lent the time when we practice wearing our somber faces?

Well, the answer is that, in times past, Lent was the season when we gave up those things that we really knew, down in our heart-of-hearts, weren't all that good for us. And yes, Lent was the time, back then, when we put our smiles away and were supposed to mourn over our shortcomings and failings.

Back in the day, Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent was preceded by a pre-Lenten celebration. Known in various places as Shrove Tuesday ("Shrove" comes from the Old English word meaning "to forgive"), or Mardi Gras (which means "Fat Tuesday", coming from the French), it was the day when feasting and enjoyment (gastronomic, usually) preceded the day of self-denial (Ash Wednesday) and the giving up of things like fattening foods and the like.

Speaking liturgically, the structure of the Lenten season is a bit unusual. Lent is forty days long, and is patterned on our Lord's temptation, which – we are told in Holy Scripture – lasted forty days and forty nights. But the Lenten season is punctuated by the Sundays in Lent. The idea is that each and every Sunday in the year is a celebration of our Lord's resurrection. So, for example, it is proper to say "The First Sunday in Lent", not "The First Sunday of Lent". The Lenten season is forty days long, minus the Sundays in the season. The result is that the Sundays in the Lenten season are celebrations, but they are somewhat muted celebrations (compared to other liturgical seasons), being affected by the tenor of the Lenten season which surrounds them, both before and after. So, then, we set away our "Alleluias" until Easter, as one example of the changes in our worship during Lent. Another liturgical custom is the removal of the Christ Candle at the front of the church. In some places crosses are veiled with cloth.

The liturgical color for Lent is also instructive for our calling and work in the Lenten season. The color violet (usually called "purple") was, in biblical times, associated with royal persons or with persons of high rank or wealth. In addition, purple cloth was expensive to make, and also very difficult to make, for it entailed the harvesting of many, many small snails that live in the ocean. Divers would harvest these snails in order to obtain enough to dye the cloth.

The violet color could serve to remind us of two aspects of our focus in the Lenten season, for we are making our way toward Palm Sunday, toward the events of Holy Week, and toward our Lord's resurrection on Easter Sunday morning. So then, we are honoring that One whom God has appointed to be King of kings and Lord of lords, who rose victorious over death and sin on Easter morning. The difficulty associated with the making of violet-colored cloth can remind us of the difficulty that often comes when we seek to make amends for our shortcomings and the ways in which we fail to commend the faith that is within us.

So then, what form might our Lenten observance take these days?

Some traditional patterns from times gone by still apply: Some people, lamenting their sins and offenses, will undertake a focused time of self-examination, confession and renewal. Not a bad idea for our Lenten journey, if one's faith has lost some of its warmth. For many of us, Lent isn't so much the giving up of things, as it is a time to do some spiritual "house cleaning", to examine those things we find time and energy to do day in and day out, to see if adjustments are in order, so that God might be honored more worthily. Lent can be a time of renewal, of re-acquainting ourselves with God, a time of taking up a spiritual discipline in order that God might take first place in our lives.

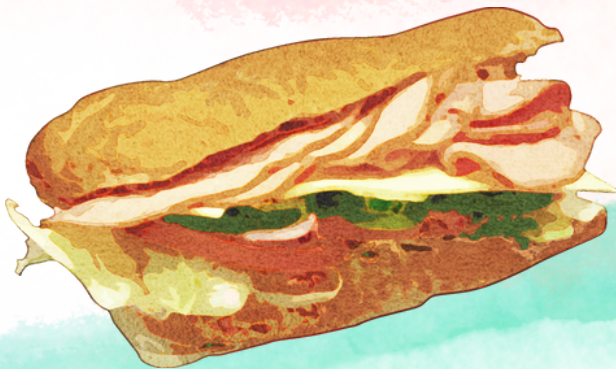

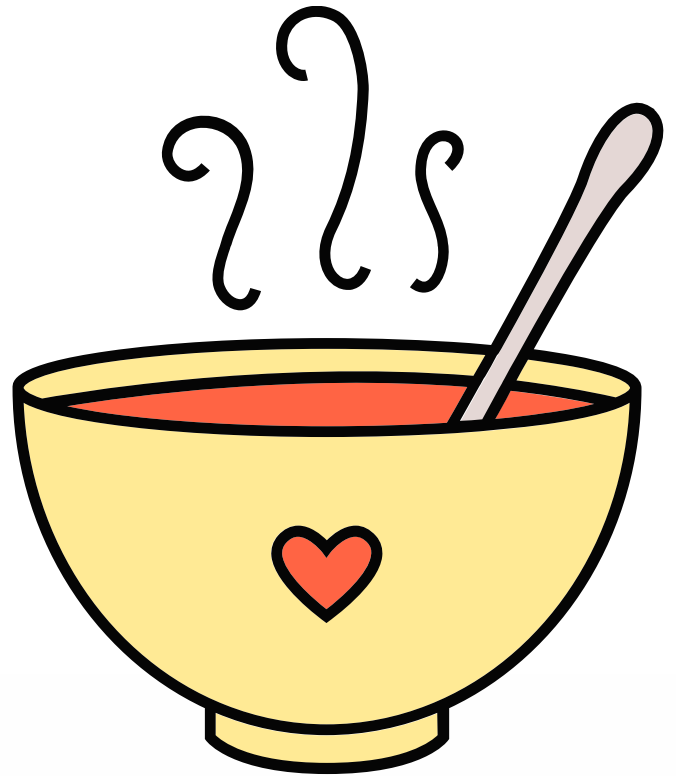
